

## A NOTE FROM THE PRODUCERS:

Where the Souls Go takes place in the honeyed light of dreams deferred and stands as an unexpected bookend to our last play at New Theater Hollywood, The Death of A Star. While both plays were created separately, on opposite ends of the globe, they both inspect the disease of this town; the desire for fame. While The Death of A Star followed a handful of desperate young starlets, Where the Souls Go takes place in the chamomile folds after the war of aspiration. In short, this play is about those who survived. Set at the Carriage Trade, a sleepy gay bar in Hollywood, Dorothy stumbles on an aging queen, a Buddhist

leather daddy, and a real-life doll, all luxuriating in the ebbs and flows of reminiscing. "You gotta recognize that desire is the root of all suffering," the leather daddy tells us, but no one seems to listen. Melancholy meets camp and they all just want to be loved and present. Over many miniature martinis the importance of that third space is revealed; not church, not the public square, but those hallowed halls where queers feel safe and family exists even in the horror of a rapidly regressing world. The gay bar is always a theater. Grab the velvet. Hit the lights. It's a show.



KAHBIA SADA is a multidisciplinary artist and performer from central Florida, now based in Los Angeles. Sada creates narrative art through puppetry, embroidery, and papier-mâché, exploring her Haitian heritage through a lens of childlike wonder.



COLIN SELF is a puppeteer, composer, director and community organizer who likes to have fun, and challenge his friends to do things they've never done before. In other words, Colin is a conductor of light.



BAILEY DEAN STILES is from Carthage Missouri, the birthplace of Precious Moments. Discovered at Cracker Barrel, and debuting at New Theater Hollywood, Bailey is an actress, artist, musician, hairstylist, and living doll.



DIAMOND STINGILY is a brave and problematic American artist. She refuses to be boxed in, and has the audacity to proclaim herself as an "actress." In her spare time she likes to read and watch movies.
